### **The Reformation influence on the Protestant Orthodoxy formation**

*The Reformation as a natural socio–religious movement became a milestone event in society of the late Renaissance. Although under current conditions of sovereign states development, during their spiritual rebirth, it has kept its hermeneutic potential, which universally significant for Christian tradition.
